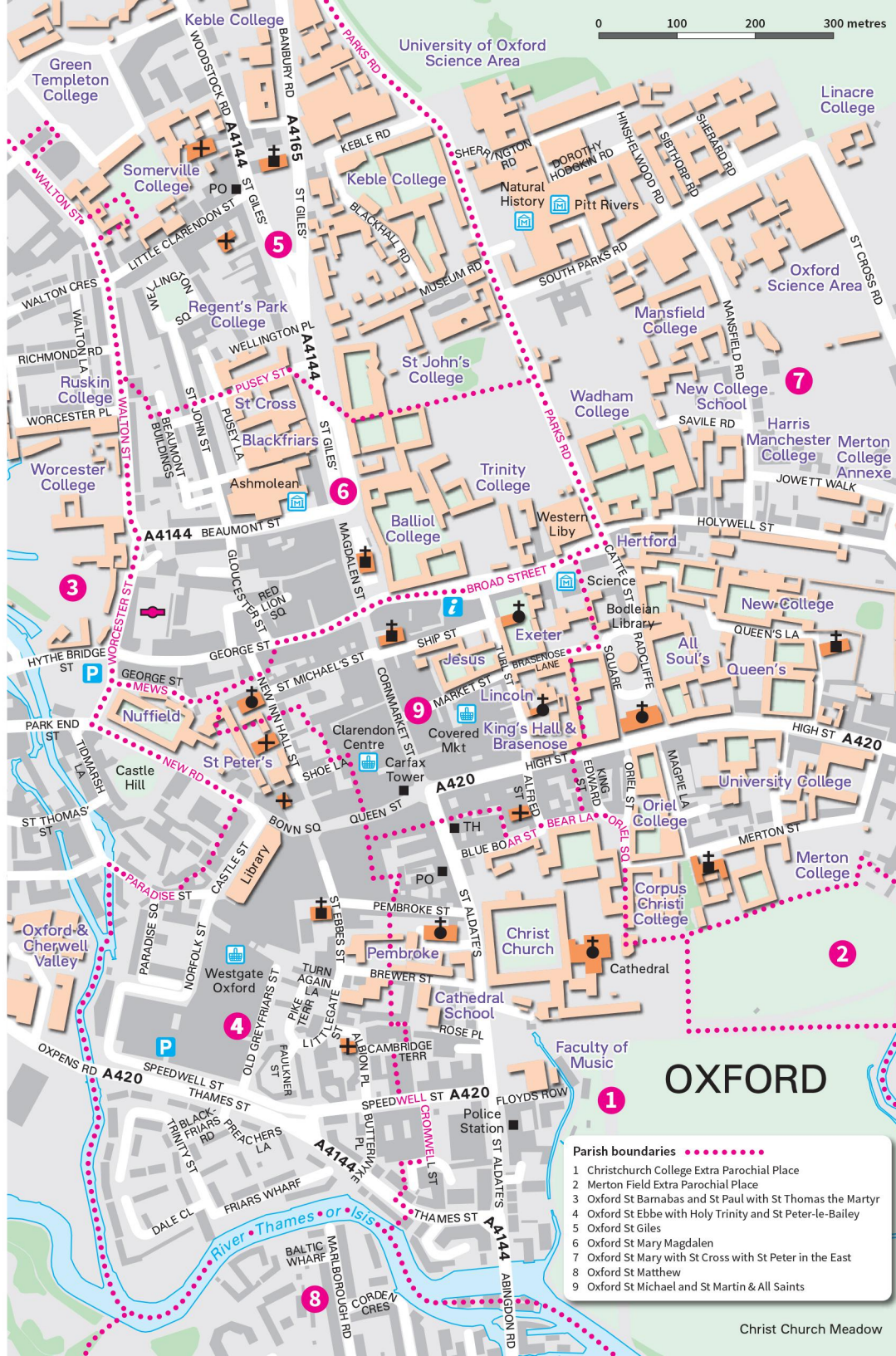
3. Which street name is also a driving instruction? And can you find a street on the map that sounds like it could describe the characteristics of a fast car?

6. What is the fewest number of parish boundaries you have to cross to make your way from one coloured animal to another?

7. If there were two of this word on the map, there'd be joy. On its own, there's only sorrow. What is it?
8. Imagine connecting the numbered parish legend points with straight lines in increasing numerical order. How many complete (three-sided) triangles are formed?
